FOR THE PAST DECADE, the Provost's Office has issued an annual report each fall, reporting in depth on Rutgers-Newark accomplishments during the previous year. It has been a valuable communications tool, as well as a historical record of each year.



As eager as I am to spread the good word about R-N, this year's state budget crisis requires new thinking to use campus funds more prudently than ever. The result is this much-abbreviated report, a

"snapshot," of sorts, illustrating selected accomplishments over the past year and some pertinent facts about R-N. It frames new academic programs, community-campus initiatives, faculty scholarship, student achievements and campus expansion. Construction of University Square

Built to meet the demand for additional student housing, University Square is the latest addition to creating a dynamic 24/7 atmosphere at Rutgers in Newark. Home to nearly 600 students, the new 13-story facility features a landscaped courtyard, retail spaces on the first floor, and a red-brick facade that blends in with the historic aspects of its neighborhood.

School of Public Affairs and Administration Established

The new school will allow Rutgers to further expand its contributions to the field of public administration and the more efficient use of government resources. Serving as dean is Marc Holzer, Rutgers Board of Governors Professor of Public Administration and longtime chair of the Graduate Department of Public Administration.

"A Conversation with Gov. Thomas Kean"

Chair of the National Commission on Terrorist Attacks on the United States, and past president of Drew University, former Gov. Thomas Kean made a special trip to Rutgers-Newark last October. In a discussion moderated by Board of Governors Distinguished Service Professor of History Clement Price, he shared his thoughts on urban revitalization and his careers in public service and higher education.

\$1 Million Howard Hughes Medical Institute Grant The three-year grant awarded jointly to Rutgers-Newark, the New Jersey Institute of Technology and the University of Medicine and Dentistry will be used to develop a novel quantitative neuroscience doctoral training program. The grant was one of only 10 awarded from among 132 applicants.

We're No. 1 – Again. “In educating students together from so many different national, ethnic, racial and religious backgrounds, we fulfill the highest ideals of our nation and make a powerful statement about how education and the advancement of knowledge should be pursued in an increasingly global world,” states Provost Steven Diner. That belief has again resulted in Rutgers in Newark being named the most diverse national university campus in the nation by *U.S. News & World Report*. This marks the 10th year in a row that Rutgers-Newark has topped the rankings; in fact, the campus has held this status since *U.S. News* first began evaluating diversity, back in 1997.



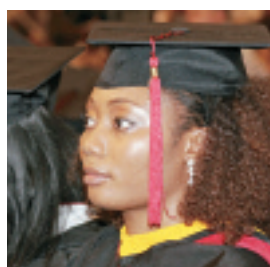

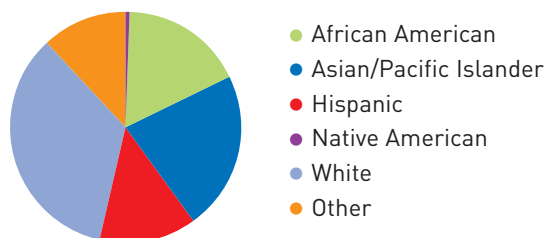
